Victorine will discuss with Greg and let Annette know the details. Annette would be in charge of formatting next Broadside due in December.

6. Old Business:

1) Fall Conference 2014: with five speakers, two pitch sessions, entertaining readings and meal, Fall conference is declared a success. The speakers were informative and entertaining and the after conference reception at Chapters was welcome. Improve for next fall conference: Send schedule out more than one time. Look into Columbus or Nebraska City for future conferences. All present discussed having one large

two day event with twice as many speakers and a pitch fest type event held at one location once during the year, instead of two smaller one day events that we have twice a year. That would require a bi-law change/vote/discussion among members. Present officers would rather leave that discussion to an incoming board that would, in fact, have to implement such change should it be approved by membership.

Final accounting of expenses/proceeds. Corrections/errors/total attended: Victorine didn't have the exact numbers as expenses weren't all submitted and Wayne Anson wasn't able to attend meeting due to schedule change but overall, it seemed the Fall conference, after food, speaker fees, hotels, etc. broke even which is a goal for NWG.

Surveys-Doug has surveys and he will tally the information and pass that on to Victorine. Victorine wants to see if anyone has expressed interest in taking the President and Vice President board positions in Fall 2015 when her and Doug's term expires. Also, she will check for interest in helping with conferences and see if anyone's expressed interest in Publication Chair.

One thing Board discussed was a scholarship award for conferences for members who forgo attending due to financial reasons. The Board discussed setting up an online form for those wishing to apply for a conference scholarship, which could pay a percentage of the conference fee in exchange for help at conferences. A limited number of scholarships could be available to members and awarded based on several factors including, but not limited to, financial need and years of membership. The form would be filled out by member requesting scholarship and that would then be discussed by the board to determine if a scholarship would be awarded. The board will continue to discuss this.

Spring Conference reservations will open online on NWG website as soon as the speakers are contacted about their presentation material. Annette has a file started for spring conference in drop box for presentations and conference info. Annette's idea for pitches spring conference: time sheets like at fall—seemed to work –give all pitch info to each person at check in –it was discussed that Mary will handle making sure all people wishing to pitch have the pitch information at check in. Joyce Sasse has volunteered again to handle corralling pitches and Mary could assist.

2)Elections: elections for President and Vice President will be held at Fall Conference 2015. Members wishing to fill those positions or who have expressed interest in filling those positions should step forward asap. We could put an announcement about this in the next Broadside.

I spend my writing time in 18th Century Scotland and whatever strikes my fancy in the National Novel Writers' Month. During the month of November, I also lead a group of young writers who participate in NaNoWriMo.

Glenda Fralin: keeps a blog for author interviews. A majority of the articles present both beginning and seasoned Nebraska authors. She's also had the good fortune to interview some authors from other parts of the nation and world. At <http://www.wordspings.blogspot.com> the reader gets to know something about the writer, drawing attention to the person behind the stories. Look back through the years to read Q and A interviews with such Nebraska authors as Mary Anderson, Marilyn June Coffey, and Sally Walker, to more recent chats with Dennis Timothy, Smashwords founder and author Mark Coker, and Ugandan Poet Denis Gadfly Muwoung. If you dig way back before the interviews, you will find some of Glenda's poetry hidden in those archives.

Lisa Kovanda: It's been a busy few months in spite of ongoing health issues. My newest book, "Walk Me Home," the true story of a man who faces the harsh realities of a life turned on end after his college sweetheart—the woman who taught him to overcome the dyslexia that got him kicked out of seminary—is murdered. His grief and anger dictate his decision process and destroy his family. In this true story, Russ must confront the murderer, Robert Williams, and decide whether to forgive, condemn, or to minister. The clock is ticking, as Williams is scheduled to die in Nebraska's electric chair. His decision will force him to face the demons of his own past, and the resulting inner journey will either destroy him or leave him forever changed. was released in ebook and print September 19th. The audiobook is in production and will be available in time for Christmas.

"Modified Flight Plan," co-written with fellow Guild member Brian Thomas, was released in audiobook format .

"Remission," the movie I co-wrote and worked on the production team for, has played at several film festivals, and the Ross Theatre in Lincoln, in addition to getting some nice reviews within the horror industry. November 20th, I was on Ghost Stalkers, a nationally televised paranormal investigation show for Destination America. It was a great experience being asked to be part of the show, make some great industry connections, and as soon as they update IMDb, it will be another credit on my list. It's nice to see that growing!
