Nebraska Writers Guild Spring Conference Coming Next Month

Plan on attending the Annual Spring Conference April 7-8 in LaVista, NE. Registration forms are on line and in this newsletter. Last year's conference was well attended and we actually ran out of room for author tables. This year's conference has speakers with topics that will be beneficial to all areas of writing.

Naturally there are breaks scheduled for participants to socialize and network. Friday activities will begin at 3:00 for Guild members only, with short seminars presented by NWG members and verbal pitch practice sessions with reviews by NWG members.

The evening will begin with registration and socializing. During this time members will sign up for short readings from their works. Members are getting more involved with this and the number of readers is limited. Come prepared to read. Just to remember to put your name in the hat before you leave the registration table.

Hope this Broadside finds our entire 258 present members alive and writing well. What an amazing year this has been already. Surely by now all of you have begun to share the excitement of the Six Corners of Nebraska, our Nebraska Writers Guild's gift to all Nebraskans celebrating our 150 years of Statehood. People can't believe we are bringing such a large event to their towns and corners of the State. Thirty-four NWG members are readers, workshop leaders, special presenters, or fundraisers for one or, in several cases, more than one of the six locations. All total you have signed on from 105 active slots, but we have opportunities left for more of you to get involved.

Now, you might think that seems unbelievable, but opportunities to serve and get your writing showcased keep coming in. The Author Showcases at the Red Path Gallery, organized by Gina Barlean to share Guild Authors with the community will occur every month for the remainder of the year. They are already booked.

Starting from two members wanting to touch base at the 2017 Constellation Science Fiction Conference, we now have volunteers staffing a Nebraska Writers Guild booth at the event. The booth will be two tables as we have invited the Nebraska Film Association members to jointly sponsor the booth. And, yes, we have a great enthusiastic group of authors that are members of both organizations.

Add to those events, the 2017 Nebraska Festival of the Book. The Festival organizers invited us to be an exhibitor and to sponsor workshops. At last count we have 11 members to staff the exhibit (and sell their books). Our California/Alaska member sent a case of books to give away. Three members volunteered to do the two writers workshops for the event (that's two-thirds of the free workshops). And other members have scheduled book signings. You folks are stepping up your visibility and we are proud to provide the opportunities.

Nancy Sharp and Jean Lukesh invited NWG members to add books to their exhibit at the Nebraska State Readers Association, 2017 Annual Conference. They will also share our NWG program materials. This is yet another generous offer we are thankful to have.

When Spring Conference rolls around, check out our own new Nebraska Writers Guild Book Release and Activities Notification Program. My personal goal is to add 1,000 names to that database in 12 months and eventually grow it to reach well beyond our state's borders. Then, when you publish or republish your materials, we can notify the network and help increase your outreach.

Now, I know I am forgetting something, but you can see the opportunities to share your work keep growing as people bring opportunities to us as an organization. But, if you did not take advantage of the opportunities, none of this would matter. Look how you are stepping out. Exciting!
